



"Limit to weekend regional trialing in magazine will be 3 paragraphs - 300-400 words and 4 pictures".

NSTRA MEMBERS - Important things to remember!

Reminders - check back often!

National trials are the responsibility of the National Officers with input from the Board of Directors and the local co-chairs of national trials. Criteria for entry, which may be subject to change, for the original 5 National Trials is available in the reference section of the Rule Book beginning on page 41, Section 11. If a particular national trial is subject to changes in the entry criteria, there will be notice provided on the official entry form, in the magazine, on the national website, and/or by email if available.

To enter a national trial, you may submit a hard copy official entry form and payment, OR you may scan and email an official entry form with payment information, OR you may send by facsimile and official entry form with payment information, OR you may enter and pay on-line on the website. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Please note that additional new national trials may be added from time to time and do not yet appear in the current Rule Book. Please contact your National Officer Representative or the National Office staff for additional information regarding such trials. The current list of National Trials is as follows:

GARMIN INVITATIONAL CHAMPI-ONSHIP TRIAL Formerly known as Quail Forever. This is a revolving trial generally held in

TRIAL OF CHAMPIONS. This trial is held in Amo, Indiana, in April.

NATIONAL AMATEUR TRIAL OF CHAMPIONS. This trial is held in Amo, Indiana, in April.

UKC PERFORMANCE TRIAL. This trial is a revolving trial generally held in June.

PURINA ENDURANCE CLASSIC. This is revolving trial generally held in September:

DOG OF THE YEAR. This trial is held in Amo, Indiana, in October.

TOP **PERFORMANCE AWARD:**

To be eligible:

*Dogs must have at least 20 open points accumulated in weekend trials between June 1 through May 31 of the applicable year. Once a dog is eligible, a schedule of scoring is applied based on the results at regional elimination trials and National Trials

*The Performance Trial will be the beginning national trial each year, even if it ends prior to June 1 in order to keep the number of national trials the same each year.

*The Regional Elimination trial results used in calculating Top Performance Awards is the regularly scheduled regional elimination championship

in the qualifying year/season (only one regional can count per year). Regionals scheduled or rescheduled to be held after June 1 will apply to the previous year. Each regional elimination will have a point value of 600 points. The value will drop 25 points per placement until the last dog or points run out (1 - 600, 2 - 575, 3 - 550, etc.). The placement for the regional eliminations is determined by the score of the last round in which the dog ran. In addition, 100 points will be awarded to the Champion, 75 for the second-place dog, 50 for the third and 25 for fourth.

*The National Trials results are calculated as follows: A dog must place in the top 32 dogs to receive a qualifying score from that trial. Each national trial will have a point value of 800 points. The value will drop 25 points per placement throughout the Saturday cut (1 – 800, 2 - 775, 3 – 750, etc.). The placement for the national trial is determined by the score of the last round in which the dog ran. In addition, 100 bonus points will be awarded to the Champion, 75 for second place, 50 for third and 25 for fourth.

HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS:

Hall of Fame nominations will be accepted in a rolling calendar throughout the year. Send these nominations to the nation office, or to a national officer no later than March 31 of the year in which a dog is to be considered. Nominations of dogs to the NSTRA Hall of Fame are NOT "carried over" to following years. Plainly stated, a dog that does not get elected to the Hall of Fame in the year nominated must be re-submitted in order to be considered for election. The National Officers, in concert with the Board of Directors, make selections to the Hall of Fame each April.

TRIAL SCHEDULES:

Fall/winter trial schedules are due in the office by May 1. Spring/summer trial schedules are due in the office by Nov. 1. All trials must be published on the website 4 weeks prior to their running.

SANCTION FEES:

Trial sanction fees are required BEFORE a trial packet is mailed and before a trial may be "approved" in the system. Please pay all sanction fees at least 4 weeks prior to your trial date to ensure prompt mailing of the packet and to ensure that the trial may be drawn in a timely manner.

TRIAL REPORTS:

Trial reports and results should be entered into the trial draw system as soon as possible after a trial and no later than 10 days after the trial date. Overall results will not be approved until the reporting is complete. First place points and championships will not be confirmed or awarded until the reporting is complete. (This includes receipt of all registration paperwork for placing dogs.)

HOME REGION:

Members requesting a change of Home Region must do so, in writing, through the National Office between the dates of October 1 and January 1..

*Exception: A member who permanently relocates to within the boundaries of a Region, other than their Home Region, may make written application to the NSTRA office at any time to request a change in their Home Region.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIPS:

Associate memberships are available to members' spouses and children 18 years and under, still living at home. There must be at least one regular paid membership in the household to qualify. Associate members have the same rights as regular members with respect to participating in field trials (e.g., owning dogs, handling dogs, judging, bird planting, etc.). Associate member may not vote in any regional or national elections including rule or bylaw changes, they cannot hold an office, and they do not receive a magazine.

RULE CHANGES:

Proposed rule changes or new additions shall be submitted sixty (60) days prior to the first day of the Trial of Champions and/or the Dog of the Year trial.

CONSTITUTION/BY-LAW CHANGES:

All proposed amendments to the

Constitution and By-laws shall be submitted to the National Officers at least ninety (90) days prior to the first day of the Trial of Champions and/or the Dog of the Year trial.

REGION HIGH POINT:

Points earned in the qualifying rounds of a Regional Elimination or a Championship trial DO count towards the region's high point competition. Points earned in the finals of above trials DO NOT count towards the region's high point.

OWNERSHIP CHANGE:

Once a dog takes a NSTRA placement, any subsequent ownership changes must be sent to the NSTRA office. Please send a copy of new registration papers with the new owners' names to the office. The date of transfer will be the date shown on the registration papers.

UNREGISTERED DOGS:

As of June 1, 2022 a dog cannot run in a NSTRA trial without a system-generated dog profile or record. A trial coordinator cannot create the record. National staff or officers can only create the record once registration papers are received in the NSTRA office. In addition, there remain many "unapproved" dogs in the system. Unapproved dogs shall not be entered to run in trials until proper paperwork is received and appropriate action to create the record is completed. This can either be submitted by the owner or the trial chairman. We will accept copies by fax (317-839-4197), e-mail (office@nstra. org), or a photocopy by regular mail.

NSTRA DISTINGUISHED MEMBERS:

The NSTRA Distinguished Members award honors those extraordinary men and women whose contributions and achievements significantly helped develop, or continued to improve, the National Shoot to Retrieve Field Trial Association, Inc. This award will be presented annually at the Dog of the Year banquet. Nominations may be submitted at any time to the staff at the national office, to a National Officer, or to the current chair of the Distinguished Members Committee. A short description of the individual and their contributions to NSTRA should be sent to the national office. A picture of the individual should be included, if

available. Contact the NSTRA office for a list of criteria. The committee will review all Nominations and verify contributions.

Decisions will be made not only by the information submitted but by any other information collected. The committee will make their decision by the April Board of Directors' meeting. A permanent plaque will be located at the NSTRA office with a smaller plaque awarded to the individual or their family if deceased.

NSTRA TRIAL DATES and QUALIFYING DATES

2025 Purina Endurance Classic Dickinson, ND September 3-6, 2025

The number of dogs in the trial shall be a maximum of one hundred twenty-eight. Region quotas will be determined based on number of trials held in each region June 1st to May 31st.

Entry into this trial is based on all open points earned within a dog's home region and placement points earned from qualifying rounds of a National Trial during the period of June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2025.

2025 Dog of the Year Amo, IN October 22-25, 2025 Must run in 2025 regional

2026 Garmin Invitational Lake Wales, FL February 25-28, 2026

Qualification: Nov 1, 2024 through October 31, 2025 – All open points earned during the time frame except points earned from placements in the top 4 of a national championship trial or regional championship trial. Qualifying rounds do count. Entry is based on the number of points.

Trial of Champions Amo, Indiana April 22-25, 2026

Championship and is at least a 1x champion by February 1 of the current year. A dog can be a paid standby for this trial by achieving their Championship between Feb 1, 2026 and March 31, 2026.

Amateur Trial of Champions Amo, Indiana April 22-25, 2026


Amateur Championship by February 1, 2026, and is NOT an open champion. A dog can be paid standby for this trial by achieving their Amateur Championship between February 1, 2026 and March 31, 2026.

2026 UKC Performance classic. May 27-30, 2026.

Points earned from April 1, 2025 through March 31, 2026.

Dogs will be eligible to enter the trial based on open points earned from weekend trials only. All open points will count except those points earned during qualifying and final rounds of the National Championship and Regional Championship Trials.






Add A Dog's Picture Click to download How-To PDF

NOTE: If your picture needs editing, do it before you select the picture. Save the edited picture to your files and be sure to select that version.






Allen L. Greeling Sr. February 5, 1934 - June 6, 2025

On June 6, 2025 one of the stalwarts of National Shoot to Retrieve in the Illinois Region passed away. Allen Greeling 91, was a member of NSTRA for over 45 years. During most of that time, almost to the end, Allen trialed extensively throughout the Midwest. To know Allen was to know about his love for his family, bird dogs, NSTRA trialing, judging and bird dog training.

Allen enjoyed a good cigar while judging and riding the four wheeler. Aside from being a fierce ,but fair competitor , after his retirement from " real work" Allen trained bird dogs for the public. This came about as his fellow competitors always saw Allen handling well, well broke dogs and sought his training expertise. There was no one better at force breaking a dog. Most trials in the region would feature many dogs trained by Allen.

But what Allen enjoyed the most was encouraging youngsters to engage in field trialing, and in particular , NSTRA trialing. He was well known for selling well broke dogs to young folks at a very accessible price so they would be able to trial. He was always available , when asked, to share his advice and was responsible for many youngsters participating in NSTRA trials. A few years ago Allen was nominated by his peers in the region for the " most distinguished member award". He received that award and was very proud of it.

The Illinois region and NSTRA has lost a well respected and valued member. It comforts his friends and family to know that his life was a life lived to its fullest, always doing what he enjoyed the most, running and training dogs and serving his fellow men. Rest in peace, Allen. Enjoy the bird dogs of heaven.



How did you get started in NSTRA?

We purchased our first dog from Big Red Brittany's in Pierce NE. Scott introduced us to NSTRA and I later met Aaron Hunt through a mutual friend at Rock Creek and was hooked even though I did not have a clue of what I was doing.

What was the name of your first dog and did you raise it yourself?

Had People Stories by: Flandy Schultz



Vern grew up on a small farm in Nebraska, one of seven children. He is the only surviving child. He told me about each one of his siblings, how one married and had all girls, and one had all boys, with amazement in his voice. He told me about life on the farm. He told me about the Oregon Trail, how it cut through their farm, and how you can even see the ruts left in the dirt. Once he and his sister had to go out and double feed the cows when a particularly bad blizzard was settling in. He was about 10 and his sister was 12. The cows were about 5 miles away. After they rolled the hay off the back of the old truck, they headed back to the house and realized the road was drifted over and they couldn't see it. In addition, they couldn't see through the windshield with the snow and ice sticking to it. So, Vern got out on the running board, while his sister drove, and he gave her directions. They ended up driving across the pasture, into the teeth of the storm, to a cross fence, then driving the fence line a mile until they hit a road that was protected in the river bottom. Vern got down and pulled the staples from the barbed wire post so they could drive through the fence and on to the road and make their way home. He said his feet were frostbitten so bad, the bottom layer of skin came off a week later. He

said it hurt pretty bad, and he lost all the skin off the bottom of his feet.

One day, Vern rode their mule, Bob, to the County Fair. He asked to enter the race, and was told, "Sure, we have room, kid." So, Vern rode Bob to the track. It was a money race, and money was hard to come by back then. He got some looks riding Bob, the mule. He and Bob were in the gaggle of Quarter Horses when they hit the start line. The Pace Horse veered off the course and the horses took off. Vern was riding bareback with no bridle, and when the horses took off, Bob took off too and Vern went off the back and hit the ground. He got up, dusted himself off and watched as riderless-Bob won the race by three lengths. The people in the stands were cheering and laughing in equal parts. They'd never seen a mule run like that. Vern was hoping he'd made some money, but they said no. Only First Place got money, and they had a rule about riderless mules, or horses for that matter.

In Wisconsin, one beautiful Fall day, we made it back to the old church that was now a Bed and Breakfast. I noticed across the road was an old log



cabin. It was squat and low with thick logs, no windows, and a large plank door with a locked chain holding it closed. There were old apple trees scattered about and grown-up pastures and either side of a nice creek. I asked the proprietor about it at dinner. He said, "There's a story about that old place. It hasn't been lived in for over 80 years. We don't own that place, but wish we did. The family won't sell it, but they won't live there, either. The last time anyone lived there was back in the 1920's." The old man that lived there was the town hermit. His wife died, and, after that, he only showed his face to take apples to town to sell, or maybe a cow or two, and, then to buy whatever he needed to live for the next month or two. One winter, it was especially cold. In Wisconsin, not far from the Lake, that's saying something. A blizzard blew in and stayed longer than most. Snow totals were epic, so much so that people were forced to stay inside, and horseback rides or even sleigh rides to town were dangerous. This wasn't unusual and those Wisconsin people took it in stride. This time, however, just getting to the dairy barns to feed and milk the cows was risking frostbite. Eventually, the storm slackened, and the temperature climbed slowly during the day to the balmy mid-teens. The townsfolk began to peek out the doors, dig themselves out, and make their way to the store, or bar, and the farmers began to cut their way along trails to get to town. After a few weeks, someone noticed the old man hadn't made an appearance. Once again, not that unusual. Finally, the mailman was able to get down the old, dirt road and make his rounds. He had mail for the church. He stopped by the old hermit's cabin, across the road, and banged on the door. Inside, he found the old man frozen stiff, in the bed, with the fireplace bare and not a stick of firewood left. The ground was so frozen, they couldn't bury him on his land until Spring. I forgot to ask what they did with the body until then.

Montana was an open-range state back when Gerald's grandfather homesteaded his 40 acres. Granddad and his wife built a house and barn and had they had a few cows and were making it all work. They had a nice little creek that ran by the house, and they had a big

garden. The cows and deer and coons, and everything else that lived around there, loved that garden. So, he and his wife fenced it off, along with a portion of the creek. After all, it was his land. One fine, Montana summer day, Granddad was tending garden when four cowboys from the nearest cattle ranch rode up on him. They informed him the fence needed to come down, because their cows couldn't access the water. My impression, given by the grandson of the Granddad, was one of typical Montana farmer bullheadedness with a dash of grit thrown in. Words were spoken, replies were given. Before long, Granddad was lassoed and dragged out of the garden, the fence was torn down, and the garden was trampled. Granddad survived the beating, but the garden didn't, and that was food they needed to survive. They managed to get to town, 10 miles away, to report it to the Sheriff, but it made no difference. The cowboys were named, but amazingly, they never left the ranch that day according to the foreman. It was a hard winter that year, but Gerald and his family were living proof they not only made it but thrived.

I was quail hunting with a rancher, on his land, in New Mexico. The ranch was in the Llano Estacado, a vast, waterless grassland in western Texas and eastern New Mexico. It was flat as a board, and before it was settled in the late 1890's, riders would get turned around in the

trackless plain and die of thirst. Two events finally allowed the area to be settled. One, the Comanches were finally settled in the 1880's, largely due to the Army being equipped with repeating rifles and pistols. Secondly, the Chicago Aeromotor windmill became widely available, allowing access to the water locked below the caleche (rock) layer. Now, cows had water and the best grass in the world. The rancher's family arrived about then and homesteaded the land and were very successful. We talked about cattle and branding and all the interesting stuff I had questions about. He told me about how his grandfather and father would, every year, join with other ranchers and have a real cattle drive to the rail head in Lubbock. I asked about fences. He said riders went ahead and the fences came down. He said his father was ecstatic when the railroad came to town.

40 miles west of the ranch is the Mescalero Ridge, a long escarpment that runs north-south. It bounds the Llano Estacado on the westside. The drop-offs are severe, and the Comanche would use the ridge to escape from the Army pursuers, using trails down and up only they knew. In the 1920's, a young couple stood on the ridge and looked over miles of sand dunes in the direction of Roswell. They had a brand-new car and figured they could drive across the dunes to Roswell and be there by lunchtime. They were found weeks later, nearly mummified in the hot, dry air.

Other stories about log flumes in the Wyoming Big Horn Mountains, one-room-school-houses in the Dakotas, hand-dug irrigation canals in Idaho, Indian petroglyphs in the Texas panhandle, Pony Express stations in New Mexico, and vast ranches stretching from Arizona deep into Mexico are only a few of the tales related to me by the interesting people I meet while chasing my Brits across the country. I look forward, every year, to meeting them and hearing more stories about the hardy and tough individuals that settled this country back in the day.



Word Salad

Trainin' Dogs with Rick Smith & Sharon Potter



We talk too much.

There, we said it. But we're human, and that's what humans do. We talk all the time, and we use our hands all the time. The problem is that our dogs don't do either of those. Well, technically they can push with their paws and they can whine or bark, but neither of those are their normal go-to behaviors. They're usually a last resort when their normal body language isn't getting results. And we'd prefer them not to not use those behaviors – nobody likes a barking dog, unless he happens to be alerting us to a strange person approaching our house, and we don't much care for being shoved and pushed by paws either.

So why the constant human chatter from us? Our dogs don't speak or understand English or Spanish or German or French or any other human language. Sure, they learn a few words and that translates to "when my human makes this sound, it means I should perform this action." It's not technically understanding the actual language. What we humans are really doing is talking to ourselves when we're constantly talking to our

dogs. We're telling ourselves, out loud, what we want the dog to do, or at least we hope he will do. That's problematic for several reasons.

First, we tend to repeat words over and over in the hope the dog will figure it out and comply. And when he doesn't respond as we planned, we say it again. Louder. From there, frustration builds on both sides as the human gets annoyed and the dog gets distracted from whatever he's trying to learn because he senses the human's frustration. After a while, all the verbal word salad becomes white noise to the dog, and he learns to ignore it. That just makes everything worse because now we have a dog that has been conditioned to not pay attention to anything we say. All they hear is Blahblahblah.

Second, we're often inconsistent with the language we use. Dogs respond best to simple, one-word commands. We tend to want the dogs to learn far more words than they need to ever understand. Keeping it clean and simple works best. If you've been reading this column for a while, you'll recall that the training method we use is called the **Silent Command System** and uses very few words.



The three basic skills a dog has to perform are the foundation of all training:



Once your dog is trained to do those three, everything else is built on that.

Here's an example of how just a few simple commands work best. Let's say your dog likes to jump up on people with his paws. What we usually hear people say is, "No! Down! Off!" and more often than not, it's all three words, like one of them will magically get the dog back on the ground. The dog rarely has been trained to respond to any of those, and they really aren't necessary for the dog to learn. If the dog knows how to stand still – meaning all four feet on the ground and not moving – a simple, "Whoa" tells the dog to stand still. If the dog doesn't respond, we can correct him for ignoring our cue to stand still. And if he's standing still with all four paws firmly on the ground, he isn't jumping on anybody. (As an aside, it's better to teach the dog not to jump on people in the first place. That's a body language and respect issue rather than a command problem.)

When training a dog to respond to any of the three things we mentioned (go with you, come to you, stand still), teach the skill first and only give it a name or command when the dog is responding well without the command. We want to form an association between the sound we make and the action the dog is doing. That can't happen if the dog isn't doing what we want.

Let's say we have a young dog that needs to understand how to come when called. Without the dog on a checkcord in the early stages, we have no way to control the dog's actions, and it's too soon to use the e-collar. Imagine we've got that dog on a checkcord and he's distracted and trying to go toward something interesting rather than to us. If we start pulling the dog in and saying, "Here" repeatedly and the dog is still pulling away and focused on going elsewhere, what connection are we making with that repeated verbal command? The better way to teach is to give repeated light tugs on the checkcord while saying nothing. When the dog focuses on you and comes toward you, use your verbal command, just once and not repeatedly. That connects the dots between the action the dog is performing and the sound you made while he was doing the right thing. A good habit begins to form.

We rarely use any sort of verbal commands because the dogs respond best to watching our body language. That's their way of communicating, and they're really good at it. When people start talking all the time, their dogs tune them out – there's no reason to pay attention to you because they know where you are. In the field our dogs are supposed to work out to the front and in the direction we're moving. There's no need to constantly tell them when to turn and where to go to look for birds. As they cover ground, they check in by swinging back in our direction or glancing over to see where we are; if well-trained they should change direction when we do.

Once someone has learned to stay quiet in the field, it will be very hard to hunt with another person who is constantly yelling and directing their dog. All that talking is distracting the dog from his job, and that reflects back to what we said earlier. A non-stop barrage of "hunt 'em up let's go come on get in there hunt 'em up atta boy hunt 'em up hey over here hunt 'em up" becomes white noise to our dogs, and they learn to ignore it and us. Once they've decided to ignore us, they tend to self-hunt. When that happens, the verbal word salad from the human becomes louder and more frustrated, which doesn't help anything. Sure, we're excited to be out hunting with our dogs, and much of the chatter we throw at the dog is once again talking to ourselves about what we want the dog to do; but it doesn't help the dog one bit.

One of my favorite sayings is: "Silence is golden, and duct tape is silver," which is a joking sort of reminder that there are ways to keep quiet. If you really put the time and effort into training your dog well, the verbal commands you'll need will be minimal, if needed at all. Your dog can keep his attention on finding birds to point, and you can relax and not feel like you have to micromanage or encourage your dog with a lot of word salad. Trust us when we say that just being out hunting is all the encouragement our dogs need. They live for it. Stay silent and watch the dog do his magic. Your dog will appreciate it, and both you and him will benefit in the long run.







MEET THE GUN DOGS PART 4

Gun dogs or bird dogs are types of hunting dogs developed to assist hunters in finding and retrieving game. The term hunting dog is broad and includes all breeds and skills of hunting canines, but "gun dogs" refers to canines that are trained to work alongside a loud firearm while hunting or retrieving game.

The UKC offers registration for dogs divided into 8 Groups. One of these is the Gun Dog Group. In Vol 234 and Vol 235 we visited some of these breeds to become more acquainted with them. The UKC registers 63 breeds in the Gun Dog Group. In this issue we will continue exploring "Gun Dog" breeds. FYI, "Braque" means pointing dogs in French.

The following breed standards are reprinted with permission from United Kennel Club ®"

Gun Dog Group

The goals and purposes of this breed standard include: to furnish guidelines for breeders who wish to maintain the quality of their breed and to improve it; to advance this breed to a state of similarity throughout the world; and to act as a guide for judges.

Breeders and judges have the responsibility to avoid any conditions or exaggerations that are detrimental to the health, welfare, essence and soundness of this breed, and must take the responsibility to see that these are not perpetuated.

Any departure from the following should be considered a fault, and the seriousness with which the fault should be regarded should be in exact proportion to its degree and its effect upon the health and welfare of the dog and on

the dog's ability to perform its traditional work.

History

There are two types of French Pointing Dogs: the large size, which are known as the Gascogne type; and the smaller size, which are known as the Pyrenean type. The Braque Francais, De Grande Taille is a large sized Gascogne type breed, originally from the Southwest of France and the Central Pyrenees.

The Braque Francais De Grande Taille was recognized by the United Kennel Club in 2006.

General Appearance

A Braque type pointing dog of medium proportions and noble appearance, powerful, strong and robust but not overly heavy. The females are finer. The skin is supple and loose.

Head

Substantial, but not too heavy.

SKULL

Almost flat or very slightly rounded, with a slight median furrow. No prominence of occiput. The stop is moderate.

MUZZLE

Somewhat shorter than the skull. Broad and rectangular, sometimes convex in profile. The toplines of the skull and muzzle are slightly divergent. The lips are pendant.

TEETH

The Braque Francais, De Grande Taille has a complete set of evenly spaced, white teeth meeting in a scissors or level bite.

Disqualifications: Overshot or undershot bite.

Nose

Broad, brown in color, with well opened nostrils.

Disqualification: Split nose. Pronounced lack of pigment on the nose.

EYES

Deeply set and well opened, with a frank expression. Chestnut brown or dark yellow in color.

Disqualifications: Entropion, ectropion, or pink spots on the eyelids.

EARS

Medium length, set at eye level, and not too broad at the base. Slightly folded, and rounded at the tips. Must reach to the rear edge of the nose leather.

Neck

Of good length and slightly arched. There is always a slight dewlap.

Forequarters

The shoulders are very muscular, and moderately oblique. The upper arm is strong and well muscled.

FORELEGS

Long, straight and vertical.

Body

The chest is broad and deep to the elbow. The ribs are well rounded. The back is strong and straight, sometimes a bit long, but always well supported. The loin is short, muscular and slightly arched. The croup is slightly oblique. The belly is flat with only slight tuck up.

Hindquarters

Very straight and vertical, with fleshy, muscular thighs. The hocks are moderately angulated and the rear pasterns are short.

Feet

Nearly round with tight, well arched toes. The nails are strong and the pads are thick and fleshy.

Tail

Set off the natural line of the croup. Generally docked, but a natural tail or a natural bob are not a fault.

Disqualification: Complete absence of a tail.

Coat

Rather thick and well furnished, finer on the head and ears.

Color

Chestnut brown, either solid or mixed with

white. With or without ticking or roaning or tan markings.

Height

Height at the withers for males is 23 inches to 27 inches. For females, it is 22 inches to 26.5 inches. Preferred size is 24-25 inches.

Disqualifications

(A dog with a Disqualification must not be considered for placement in a conformation event, and must be reported to UKC.)

Unilateral or bilateral cryptorchid.

Viciousness or extreme shyness.

Albinism.

Overshot or undershot bite.

Split nose.

Pronounced lack of pigment on the nose.

Entropion, ectropion, or pink spots on the eyelids.

Complete absence of a tail.

The docking of tails and cropping of ears in America is legal and remains a personal choice. However, as an international registry, the United Kennel Club is aware that the practices of cropping and docking have been forbidden in some countries. In light of these developments, the United Kennel Club feels that no dog in any UKC event, including conformation, shall be penalized for a full tail or natural ears.

Official UKC Breed Standard ©Copyright 2006, United Kennel Club



The goals and purposes of this breed standard include: to furnish guidelines for breeders who wish to maintain the quality of their breed and to improve it; to advance this breed to a state of similarity throughout the world; and to act as a guide for judges. Breeders and judges have the responsibility to avoid any conditions or exaggerations that are detrimental to the health, welfare, essence and soundness of this breed, and must take the responsibility to see that these are not perpetuated. Any departure from the following should be considered a fault, and the seriousness with which the fault should be regarded should be in exact proportion to its degree and its effect upon the health and

welfare of the dog and on the dog's ability to perform its traditional work.

HISTORY

There are two types of French Pointing Dogs: the large size, which are known as the Gascogne type; and the smaller size, which are known as the Pyrenean type. The Braque Francais, De Petite Taille is a small sized Pyrenean type breed, originally from the South West of France and the Central Pyrenees. The Braque Francais De Petite Taille was recognized by the United Kennel Club in 2006.

GENERAL APPEARANCE

A Braque type pointing dog of medium proportions and noble appearance, not heavy but sufficiently muscled. The females are finer. The skin is tighter than on the Gascogne type.

HEAD Substantial, but not too heavy.

SKULL - Almost flat or very slightly rounded, with a slight median furrow. No prominence of occiput. The stop is moderate.

MUZZLE - Somewhat shorter than the skull. Broad and rectangular, sometimes convex in profile. The toplines of the skull and muzzle are slightly divergent. The lips are less pendant than on the Gascogne type.

TEETH - The Braque Francais De Petite Taille has a complete set of evenly spaced, white teeth meeting in a scissors or level bite.

Disqualifications: Overshot or undershot bite.

NOSE - Broad, brown in color, with well opened nostrils. Disqualification: Split nose. Pronounced lack of pigment on the nose.

EYES - Deeply set and well opened, with a frank expression. Chestnut brown or dark yellow in color. Disqualifications: Entropion, ectropion, or pink spots on the eyelids.

EARS - Medium length, set on above the eye line, and not too broad at the base. Barely folded and rounded at the tips. Must end one inch short of the nose leather.

NECK

Of good length and slightly arched. There may be a slight dewlap.

FOREQUARTERS

The shoulders are muscular and moderately oblique. The upper arm is strong and well muscled. FORELEGS - Long, straight, and

vertical.

BODY

The chest is broad and deep to the elbow. The ribs are well rounded. The back is strong and straight, sometimes a bit long but always well supported. The loin is short, muscular and slightly arched. The croup is slightly oblique. The belly is flat with more tuck up than the Gascogne type.

HINDQUARTERS

Very straight and vertical, with fleshy, muscular thighs. The hocks are moderately angulated, and the rear pasterns are short.

FEET

Nearly round with tight, well arched toes. The nails are strong, and the pads are thick and fleshy.

TAIL

Set off the natural line of the croup. Docked or natural or a natural bob. Disqualification: Complete absence of a tail.

COAT

Fine, and short.

COLOR

Chestnut brown, either solid or mixed with white. With or without ticking or roaning or tan markings.

HEIGHT

Height at the withers for males is 18.5 inches to 23 inches. For females, it is 18.5 inches to 22 inches. Preferred size is 19.5-21.5 inches.

DISQUALIFICATIONS (A dog with a Disqualification must not be considered for placement in a conformation event, and must be reported to UKC.) Unilateral or bilateral cryptorchid. Viciousness or extreme shyness. Albinism. Split nose. Pronounced lack of pigment on the nose. Overshot or undershot bite. Entropion, ectropion, or pink spots on the eyelids. Complete absence of a tail.

The docking of tails and cropping of ears in America is legal and remains a personal choice. However, as an international registry, the United Kennel Club, Inc. is aware that the practices of cropping and docking have been forbidden in some countries. In light of these developments, the United Kennel Club feels that no dog in any UKC event, including conformation, shall be penalized for a full tail or natural ears. NSTRA Hall of Fame

The purpose of the NSTRA Hall of Fame is to recognize and honor dogs which contributed significantly to the ideals and goals as established under the original constitution and by-laws of the organization. NSTRA fosters the growth of walking style, quality field trials for all the pointing breeds of dogs. These field trials effectively extend the activity of upland bird hunting opportunities beyond open seasons for wild birds.

Nominations are accepted from November 1 through March 31 of each year. Each nomination is scored according to the current point system and the two top scoring dogs are chosen from among the nominations for the award. To qualify for the NSTRA Hall of Fame, a dog must accumulate 13 points through any combination of the following:

7	Top Performance V	Vin	6 points

8 points

Regional Championship 2 points

Each 5 NSTRA Championships 1 point

If a qualified nomination is not selected in a given year, the nomination may be re-submitted in subsequent years.


